The Mission of Livingston County Catholic Charities is the work of the Catholic Church, to share the love of Christ by performing the corporal and spiritual works of mercy.

VISION STATEMENT

Livingston County Catholic Charities aims to provide human services to Livingston County residents regardless of race, sex, religion, age, disability or financial ability.





We are passionate about filling the basic needs gaps of Livingston County seniors. Livingston County Catholic Charities' (LCCC) Aging Adult Specialists in the Community Liaison program assist older adults and their families by locating and securing local/state/federal services and resources to enhance the ability of aging adults to maintain independence within the comfort of their own home.

The Volunteer Caregiver Program is a coalition of local volunteers who spent 329 hours making friendly visits last year! Additionally, they provided transportation 736 times for medical appointments and more.

Encounters with these seniors can bring to light home safety issues that need to be addressed. In order to meet this need

the Home Injury Control (HIC) and Chore Programs were launched in October of 2022. LCCC and Habitat for Humanity work together providing adaptations to the home environment of an older adult to prevent or minimize the occurrence of injuries. Funding has been provided by the Area Agency on Aging 1-B and through the Livingston County Board of Commissioners.

Another new position was created in early 2023 to provide outreach, education and muchneeded services to the most isolated seniors in Livingston County. Thanks to a generous grant from the Michigan Health Endowment Fund, this position also provides part-time staffing to the Fowlerville Senior Center, a rural under-served area, to provide health and wellness activities and resources to local seniors.

Thanks to you and all our other generous donors, LCCC senior services are provided on a sliding scale to ensure that *no senior is left behind* in Livingston County.

It's a New Chapter for LCCC

We are very pleased to have Adam Perry on board at Livingston County Catholic Charities as the new Executive Director. Adam is a lifelong Catholic and grew up in the Metro Detroit area. LCCC Services

Mental Health Counseling

A nationally accredited family service agency offering counseling for individuals, groups, couples, families and children. Most insurances are accepted and a sliding fee is offered for the uninsured.

Substance Abuse Prevention

Communities Mobilizing for Change in Partnership with the Livingston County Community Alliance and the Livingston Community Prevention Project. Activities include Big Red Barrel, Safe Homes, Project Sticker Shock and more.

Substance Abuse Treatment

Individual and group therapy is provided following an initial assessment and determination of appropriate level of care. Free drop-in Engagement Group is offered several times a week for those struggling with addiction. Most insurances are

accepted, along with government contracts and a sliding fee scale for the uninsured.

Volunteer Caregiver Program

Volunteer services designed to assist older adults to remain independent and in their own homes with grace and dignity.

Community Liaison Program

Connecting seniors 60+ years of age to local, state and federal resources and services to aid in living independently.

Prevention of Elder Abuse, Neglect, and Exploitation

Providing outreach and education campaigns to increase public awareness of elder abuse and how to prevent it.

Home Injury Control and Chore Programs

Providing household maintenance and adaptations to the home environment of an older adult to prevent or minimize the occurrence of injuries.

Parish Ministry

A Lasting Promise Couple's Communication and Catholic Council on Aging.

Foster Care and Adoption

Providing temporary care for children while working toward reunification with the biological family. If reunification is not possible, LCCC will seek adoptive parents for the children.

Be Our Guest Adult Day

A supportive and caring environment for memory-impaired adults who would benefit from a structured day setting. Our goal is to provide meaningful services that enrich the lives of older adults, families and caregivers.

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Continuous Care is Priceless

Did you know that LCCC takes payment on an income-based sliding scale? Having different clients pay different rates allows LCCC to absorb the costs of running their practices while still being able to help people who can't afford their regular rates. Our ability to provide continuous care, despite changes that happen in our clients' lives, really helps set LCCC apart. We have worked to expand payment options, increase telehealth offerings, adjust therapists' hours, and more to reach economically disadvantaged patients.

Jane was a 45-year-old professional who was referred through Medicaid for individual and psychiatric treatment. Jane struggled with psychosis and had a history of multiple practitioners and consistent changes with her insurance coverage due to job loss. After 7 months of therapy and psychiatry treatment at LCCC Jane had made steady gains in all aspects of her life and was able to start working again.

Based on previous treatment experiences, this is when the client's health would decline due to the loss of her Medicaid and with no ability to pay marketplace insurance costs. LCCC was the first agency where Jane was able to receive treatment and a sliding fee alternative after her Medicaid insurance option ended. She was able to benefit from an affordable rate of service based on her income and remain in a consistent therapeutic routine that eventually lead to sustainable healthy gains for the client.
